

# CANADIAN HORSE HERITAGE & PRESERVATION SOCIETY (CHHAPS) Versatility Award Point System

Points from the following four categories of activities may be collected and applied towards the CHHAPS Versatility Award.

Public appearances / Promotional events Competitive activities Non-competitive activities Work related and personal Activities

- A separate Points Recording Form is required for each horse.
- Ensure that for each activity submitted, contact information for the event organizer is recorded. This is necessary for point verification purposes
- Points continue to accumulate for the life of the horse, even if horse is transferred or sold.
- Points are NOT retroactive, so any activities completed prior to the horse being registered in the versatility program will be inadmissible.
- The point collection ends Sept 10 for each year.
- Points <u>must</u> be submitted and postmarked prior to Sept 15 for review, in order for the Versatility Award to be presented at the present year's AGM.
- Points are cumulative and those not submitted one year can be added to future years.
- Points are collected for activities done in each category. Being able to do an event for a long period of time does not denote further versatility. Therefore an activity that continues for several consecutive days is still worth 5 points.
- The lists of activities under each category are not exclusive. They are there to provide examples of the activities that qualify for each category. Use this as a guideline to categorize the various activities that you are doing.
- ☐ Members are responsible for keeping yearly records of points collected and submitted. These cumulative records will be kept by CHHAPS as well.
- In order to demonstrate true versatility, to reach the highest level awards (Gold and Platinum) points must be obtained from BOTH driving and riding activities.
- Dints necessary for each award category:
  - $\circ$  50 points (points from two or more categories) certificate
  - $\circ$  100 points (points from three or more categories) bronze
  - 250 points (points from four categories) silver
  - o 500 points (points from four categories, horse both ridden and driven) gold
  - o 1000 points (points from four categories, horse both ridden and driven) platinum

### **Public Appearances / Promotional Events**

#### 5 points for each event. Horse must be utilized at event.

Activity examples: Breed demo Club organized promotional events Historic exhibits Media appearance or interview Breed information booth Weddings Parades Public appearances Breed open house (e.g. on private farm)

## **Competitive Activities**

**5 points for each activity per event** Activity examples: In hand showir

- In hand showing English – under saddle Western – under saddle Trail Hunter/Jumper Eventing Dressage Competitive trail Rodeo events
- Pleasure driving Combined driving Endurance riding Cattle penning Cutting/Reining Pony club events Gymkhana events Horse pulls

Note: for events in which a combination of disciplines is demonstrated (e.g. combined driving, or 3 day eventing, etc), 5 points are to be awarded for each discipline. E.g. a horse participating in a combined driving event would get 5 points each for dressage, marathon, and cones.

# **Non-competitive Activities**

5 points for each activity

#### Work Related and Personal Activities

5 points per activity

Since these activities are difficult to verify, points from each type of activity in this section can only be claimed once per year.

Activity examples: Pleasure trail riding Producing a foal

Private lessons Farm work (harrowing, logging, ploughing etc)
